

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PLAN

Kindergarten - 4th Grade only

In 1 Peter 1:13 the Apostle says, "Therefore, prepare your minds for action. . .". Christ Community Lutheran School has put together an ongoing Disaster Preparedness Plan. It is our goal to prepare our facilities in the event that a natural disaster, such as an earthquake, tornado, or snowstorm, would occur while we are in session. Please keep this information handy, should you need to refer to it at a later date.

In the event of a disaster:

- No student will be dismissed from school unless a parent (or individual designated by a parent) comes for him/her.
- No child will be allowed to leave with another person, even a relative or babysitter, unless we have written permission to that effect or that particular person is listed on the **Emergency Form** in our files.
- All parents or designated parties who come for students must have them signed out at the office or at the temporary Student Station at the entrance of the school sites. Signs and staff members will direct you to the appropriate locations at each site.
- We are prepared to care for your children in times of critical situations. If you are not able to reach the school, we will care for your child here. We have a number of people with first-aid certificates, and we will be in communication with various local emergency services. We do ask for your help in the following areas:
 - Please do not call the school - we must have the lines open for emergency calls.
 - Following an earthquake or other emergency, do not immediately drive to the school - streets and access to our school may be cluttered with debris. The school access route and street entrance must remain clear for emergency vehicles. Drive with care.
 - Do turn your radio to KMOX 1120 on the AM dial. Information and directions will be given over the radio.

Kindergarten thru-4th grades Items Needed:

Small "Ziploc" Storage Bag

Please fill a zipper-type bag with:

- Non-perishable food items that will remain edible until the end of the school year. These might include: dried cereals and fruits, nuts, beef jerky, hard candy, seeds, etc.
- A note to your child reassuring them that they will be fine until you arrive.

Clearly mark the bag with your child's name and send the bag with your child on the first day of school. The bags will be stored in your child's classroom and returned on the last day of the school year.
